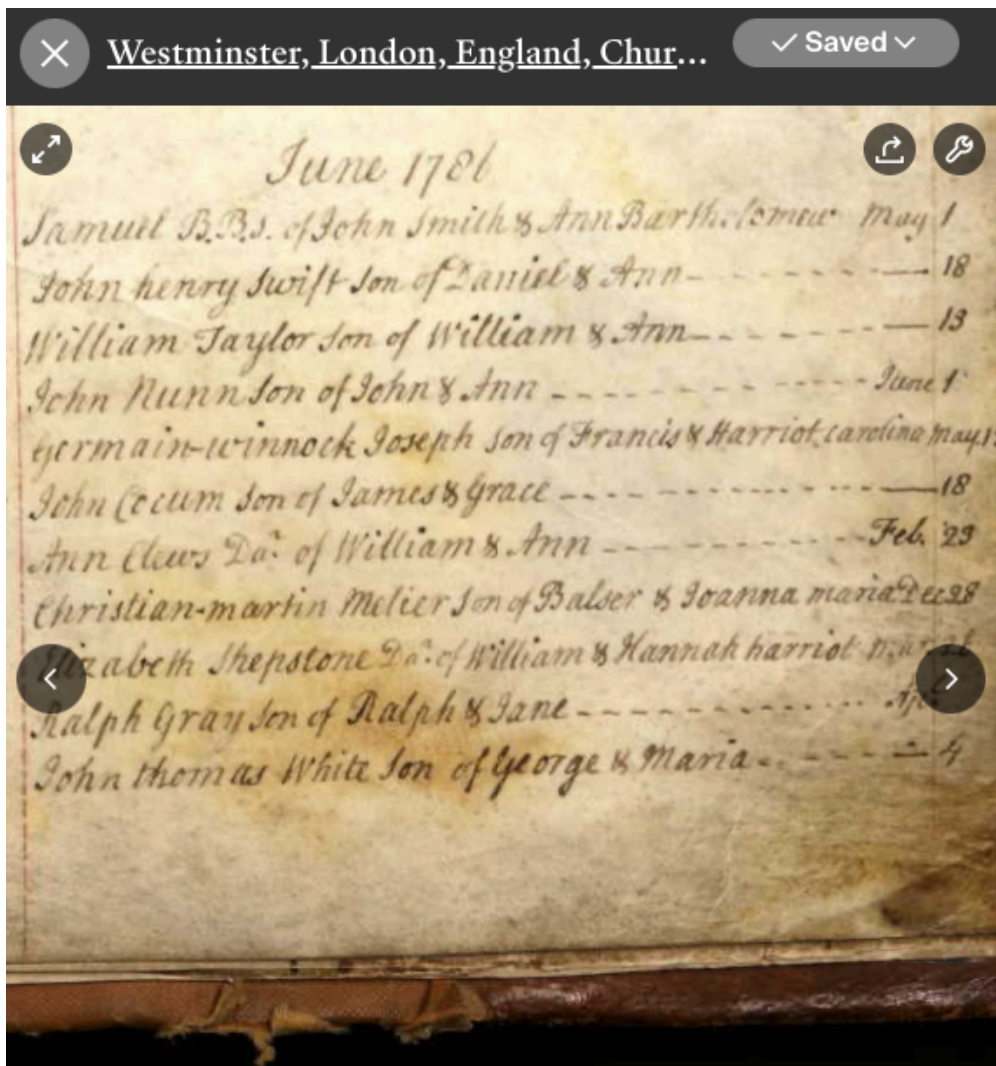

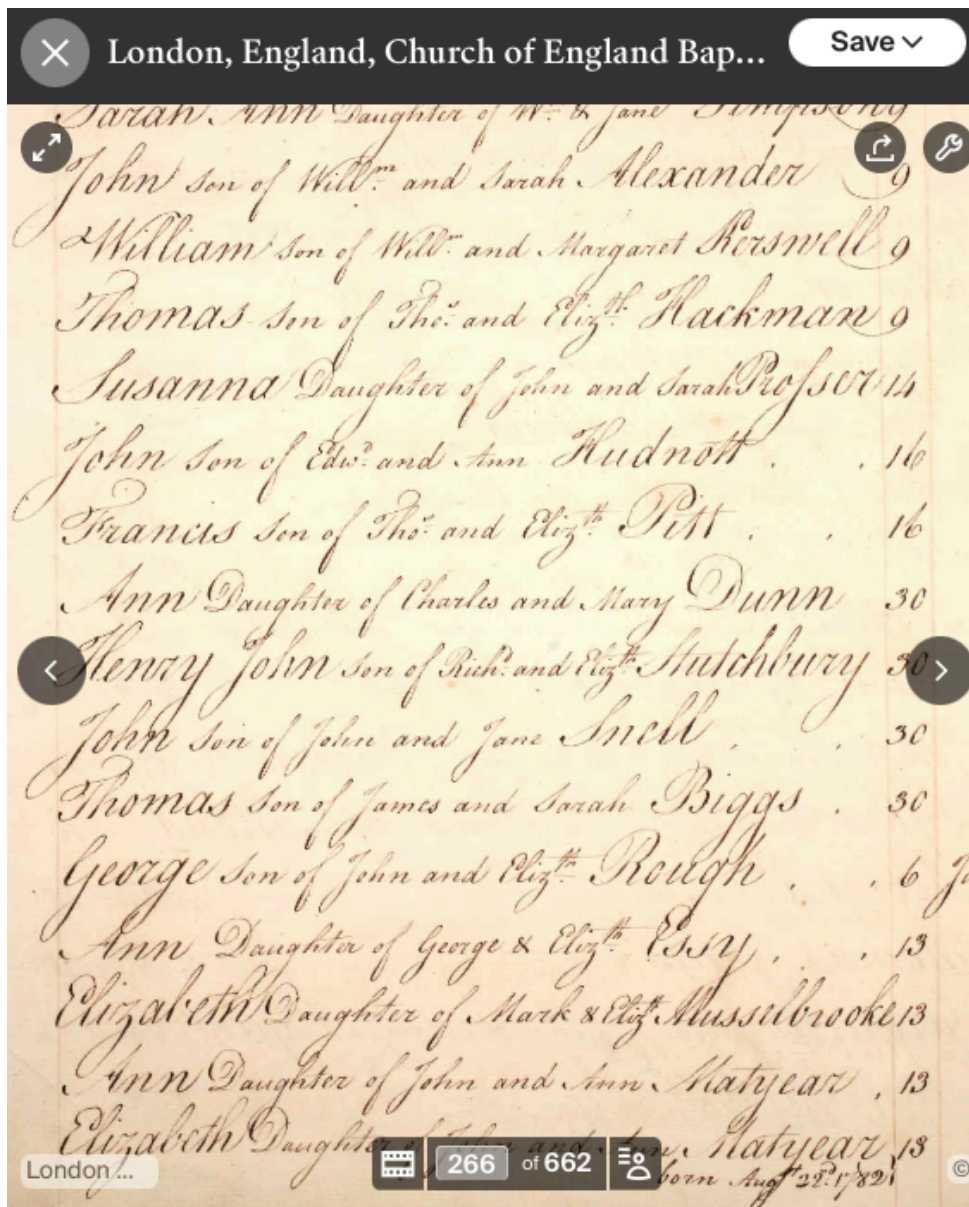

Westminster in the County of Middlesex Deceased
Thomas Hewitt of Abbeville Green near St James
Dillon in the County of Surrey Gentleman an Obed
John Propper of No 62 Duke Street Street James
Westminster in the County of Middlesex Gentleman*
are become bound unto the Right Reverend Father in God *William* by Divine Permission,
Lord Bishop of London, in the sum of

Four hundred £
Pounds of good and lawful Money of Great Britain, to be paid to him the said Lord Bishop or his lawful
Attorney, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns; For the good and faithful payment of which Sum we
bind ourselves, and *Each* of us jointly and severally for the Whole, our Heirs, Executors, and
Administrators, firmly by these Presents, sealed with our Seals. Dated the *Twenty first*
Day of *November* in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty *six*

The Condition of this Obligation is such, That if *the above*,
hereinbefore Josiah Wright the Deceased and
Administrators of all and singular the Goods, Chattels
and Credits of the said Josiah Wright late of Shepherd Street
Street in the parish of St James Westminster in
the County of Middlesex Gentleman deceased

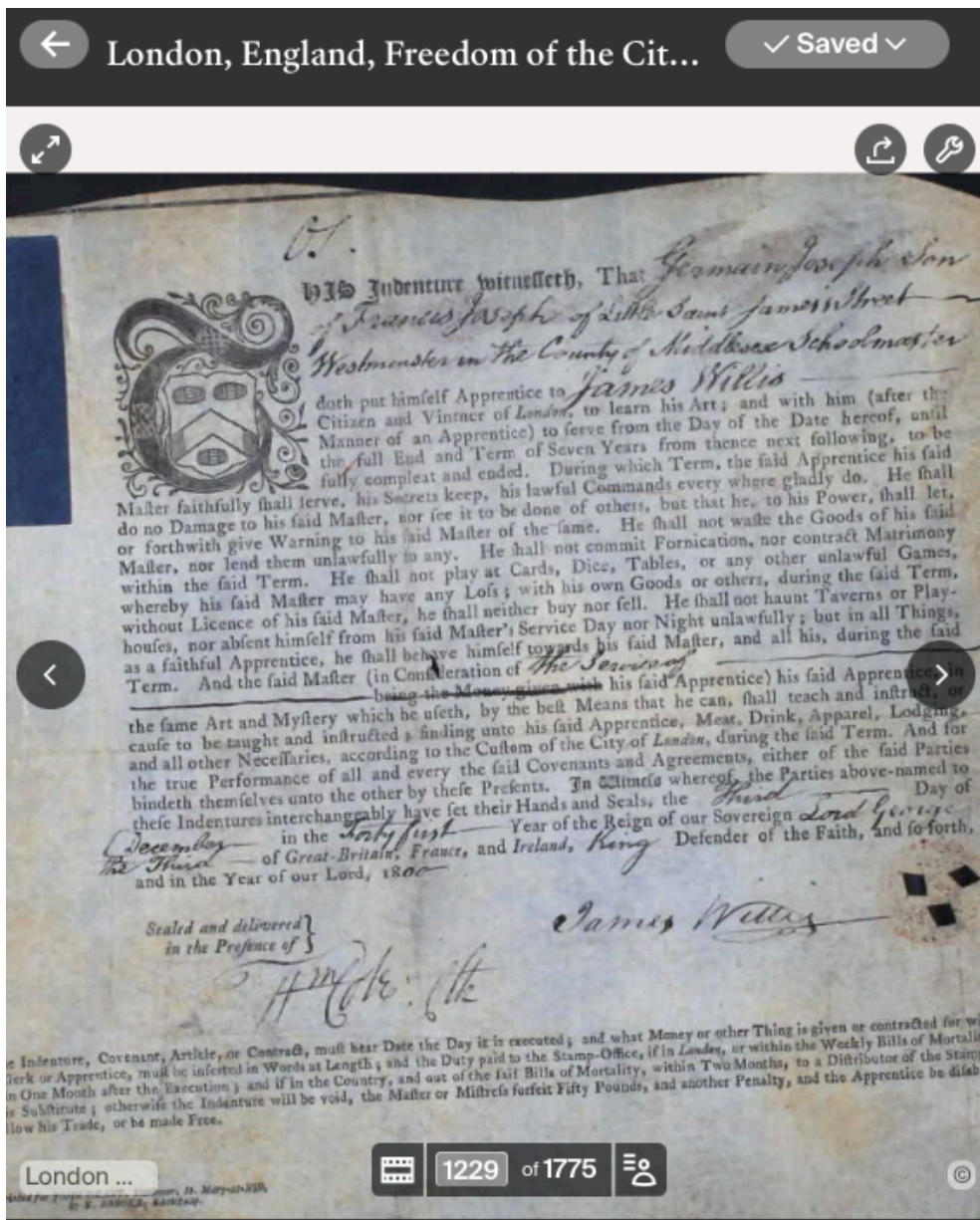
do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, and Credits
of the said Deceased
which have or shall come to the Hands, Possession, or Knowledge of *him* the said *Josiah*
Wright or into the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons
for *him* And the same so made, do exhibit *or cause to be exhibited*, in the Registry of our
Consistory Court of London, at or before the last Day of *February* next ensuing; And
the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of the said Deceased, at
the Time of his Death, which at any time after shall come to the Hands or Possession of any
other Person or Persons for *him* do well and truly Administer according to Law; and further do make, or
cause to be made, a true and just Account of *his* said Administration, at or before the last Day of
November which shall be in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty *seven*
And all the rest and residue of the said Goods, Chattels, and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the
said Administration's Account (the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge or Judges, for the
Time being, of the said Court) shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the said Judge,
or Judges, by his or their Decree, or Sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of an Act of Parliament,
intituled, *An Act for the better settling Intestate Estates*, shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear
that any last Will and Testament was made by the said Deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named
do exhibit the same into the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said
Josiah Wright being thereunto
required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (Approbation of such Testament being first
had and made) in the said Court: Then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in
full Force and Virtue.
